The new ACH Act introduces a modern framework for the protection and management of Aboriginal cultural heritage.

These new laws are designed to prioritise consultation with Aboriginal people about any land use activities that may impact their cultural heritage.

It also introduces for the first time a range of activities that are either exempt from needing an approval or only require a streamlined approval that will specifically benefit farmers and pastoralists.

Extensive consultation was undertaken across the State over the past 5 years in relation to the new Act and an extensive 12-month co-design process was completed to develop regulations and guidelines.

The WA Farmers Federation, the Pastoralists and Graziers Association and private landowners have all been constructively involved in this process, including making submissions.
