Government invests \$330,000 in sustainable trails

Thursday, 29 June 2023

- More than \$300,000 awarded to projects that support sustainable trails in WA
- Trails are a significant contributor to WA's visitor and tourism economy
- Projects funded in Shires of Broomehill-Tambellup and West Arthur

Locals and visitors alike are set to benefit from a \$331,302 investment into trail experiences across Western Australia.

The latest round of the WA Trail Planning Grants Program will support 16 projects demonstrating thorough planning and sustainability to continue growing the trails industry and enhancing the tourism economy.

Funded projects in this round include the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup's Trails Master Plan and the Shire of West Arthur's Hillman Reserve Walk Trails Project.

The funding program aims to support the sustainable planning and development of recreational trails that aligns with the WA Strategic Trails Blueprint 2022-2027.

The Blueprint was released in 2022 to guide future investment and planning consistency in the development of sustainable trails development across the State and ensure more Western Australians are connected to Country through trail experiences.
