Funding boost for water security project in the Shire of Esperance Friday, 5 May 2023

The Shire of Esperance will receive \$99,554 through the Community Water Supplies

- Over \$3.2 million in funding has been provided to local governments in dryland agricultural areas to boost their local community water supplies
- New project will support climate resilience and help minimise waste

Partnership Program

The Shire of Esperance will receive \$99,554 in funding under the State Government's Community Water Supplies Partnership Program.

The innovative project will line two farm-scale water catchments with repurposed tarpaulins sourced from grain handler CBH Group to help increase run-off into dams. It is estimated that the catchments will have a run-off efficiency of 98 per cent and be able to capture more than three megalitres per year of water at each site.

By repurposing used tarpaulins, the project supports waste minimisation in regional areas, and can result in lower project costs.

This additional water collected will be available for community purposes, including emergency use for livestock, firefighting and crop spraying operations.

The South East Premium Wheat Growers Association, landholders and the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development are committing a further \$59,876 to support the project.

The Community Water Supplies Program provides financial support to allow rural communities to adapt to changing rainfall patterns by establishing infrastructure that maximises the efficient use of available water resources.

A total of \$3.2 million has been committed over a four-year period through a collaboration between the Commonwealth and Western Australian Governments.

Up to \$100,000 is available per project for local government and communities to develop offfarm community water supply. Applicants must contribute 30 per cent of the total project value as a cash or in-kind contribution.
